

Tuesday. And a long Tuesday it was. Time chased after me from one hour to the next. But it was fun. Thank God that most days I begin with Mass. Such blessing that I am given. Familiar faces. Beautiful morning greetings with eyes now have to solely bear the smile. Although there is no congregational singing, I still can hear the gorgeous voice of the folk's spirit filling every space of the church. Although the responses are muffled by the fabric, the folk's loving hearts still pierce and penetrate through cordoned tapes and the 6 feet distance. These beginning of the day Masses are my RedBull. Such a blessing that I am given.

Being new, almost everything is a first for me. First Mass done. First funeral done. First staff meeting done. First argument with Kevin done. First Confirmation is going to be on this Thursday, and first Baptism on this coming Sunday. Bishop Mark O'Connell called me this morning to remind me of my first meeting with the Cardinal and the Presbyteral Council on September 24th. I shall have to make an appeal to keep the doors of St. Clement's Church open by inviting and welcoming the Vietnamese Catholics to come in and elevate St. Clement's Church to be the first Vietnamese Parish in the Archdiocese of Boston. I shall need to assure them that all peoples would be pastorally cared for and served. I shall need to warrant that skin colors don't matter, different languages don't matter, variety of cultures don't matter, gaps in age don't matter, and religious or political or existential convictions are welcome. A year and a half ago, while living in a little house in a remote Michigan village among the pines, the wild turkeys, the gentle deer, the feisty racoons and the gorgeous koi pond with my two beloved dogs, I was looking forward to enjoy my sunset days and had never thought that I would be here in Medford. God's sense of humor really is out of this world!

A few friends stopped by the rectory on Monday and helped me setting up a little room just across from mine. For mom's visit. We found a bed over in the old nursery of the Elementary School building. I was about to dress the bed when my sister on the phone told me that it is going to be a while. Mom is too weak from the falls. She is still unable to take care of her basic needs. If she were able to come up, one of the sisters would have to tag along. But mom is one strong willed woman. Very stubborn. Very argumentative. And extremely sensitive. Her faith will once again get her through these rough waters. I am certain that her faith will once again get her legs stronger and her arms steadier. I am certain.

Besides the train noisily rumbling by throughout the whole day, this rectory is surrounded by noises and interesting images. I really don't mind the train. I don't even mind drivers who were sometimes five cars behind punching on the horn against the car at the front who failed to move forward with the light just turning green. I don't mind spotting a woman carrying a grill along Warner street. But I do mind seeing young men and women out there running and jogging. I had not exercised since August first. These young men and women though unintentionally have caused in me a rift of guilt.

Being chased constantly by time is never a good enough excuse to let go of my exercise. Being chased constantly by worries and anxieties and uncertainties is never a good excuse to let go of hope and love. I have got to call mom and ask her once again on how she manages to keep holding fast to her faith in God.
