The refinishing work on the entrance doors of the church is done. Thanks to the Viet Catholics from East Boston. They worked so hard in stripping and sanding the wood smooth, stained and then varnished the doors. They look amazing, don’t they?

Additionally, I am still waiting to get the final approval from the Archdiocese for the replacement of the church’s roof and the repair of the school’s boiler. These two projects will cost us much more than an arm and a leg. But - risking being blasphemous here - it is better to lose an arm and a leg than to spend the East coast winter with a collapsed roof and a condemned boiler. Yes, another huge loan will be taken out from the Archdiocese. Yes, our parish is digging deeper into the Red Zone. And yes, the parish more than ever desperately needs you.

The inside of the High School building will also receive a face lift. There will be a lot of polishing and waxing of class room floors and hallways, patching up broken plaster and mending cracked walls, renovating the bathrooms, cleaning out the old text books, tightening the screws on desks, replacing stained or missing ceiling tiles, repainting the walls, and checking the pipes and the drains... A long to-do list has been generated and indeed all hands need to be on deck.

And nope, none of the seminaries that I attended had imparted in me even an iota of knowledge on these matters. Thank God that I was instructed when stumped and felt dumb to always ask for help.

I am asking you to help the parish in whichever way that you can. Together we shall rise. Together we shall stand straight and tall. Together we shall rhyme the beating of our hearts and we shall sing and hand in hand we shall dance. Together we shall rekindle hopes and dreams. Together we shall with the bells toll harmonious chimes of brothers and sisters -- of Vietnamese and Italians, Irish and Mexicans, Filipinos and Portuguese, black and brown, yellow and white, chopsticks and spoons and forks and fingers. Together we shall rebuild the Kingdom of God. Together we shall look straight into each other’s eyes, cup in the palm of our hands each other’s face, and grasp with utter certainty that we are beholding the Divine!
