### FROM FATHER PHONG

#### A rainy Monday!

I love Mondays because each is (supposedly) for me a designated day of rest. And I do love the rain.

The tin roof of my little house in Vietnam had borne many holes. Despite the constant patching, mother nature and falling debris had always managed to create openings for the pleasant sunbeam and the rain to enter. The sunbeams were greatly appreciated when electricity was cut off caused by the village's power shortage or by mom's running out of money. But the rain water was a mess to the house interior - except for the exquisite concerto it made on the tin roof and the beautiful melodies played by various pots and pans situated on the floor right under the openings. Since immigrated to America, from time to time, when it rained hard I would get into my car and go to a park. Once there I just turned off the engine, reclined the seat, closed my eyes and listened to that exquisite concerto. The metal top of the car is not the same as the tin roof. But it is the closest instrument that I have.

Advent is here. The sacred season of waiting is here. We await once again for salvation. For peace. For harmony. For love. We long once again for an end to bickerings, misunderstandings, name callings, finger pointings and blamings and accusations and drawing boundaries and building walls. We dream once again for the world to come together as one. And we pray once again the words once uttered by our Lord Jesus Christ: May they be one!

Rabbi Barukh's grandson, Yechiel, came running into his study, in tears. 'Yechiel, Yechiel, why are you crying,' asked his grandfather. His sobbing grandson explained, "I was playing hide and seek with my friend, but he stopped looking for me and left me alone. He cheated. It hurt. So I cry." Rebbi Barukh caressed Yechiel's face and, with tears welling up in his eyes, he whispered softly, "God too, Yechiel. God too is weeping." Pulling Yechiel even closer with a tight embrace, Rabbi Barukh repeated, "God too, Yechiel, is weeping. For He is hiding and we humans have quitted seeking for Him." (Adapted from Martin Buber, Tales of the Hasidim I)

God does not hide. It is just that we often have our eyes closed or have them opened partially to see God only in comfortable and familiar places. Remember the time we flew into a rage when finding out that our beautiful Italian daughter had been dating an uncouth Irish man, or our prized Portuguese son wanted to marry a heavy English accented Chinese woman? Yes, we believe in the truths that all people are God's children, all people are our brothers and sisters, all people are loved by God and all God fearing Christians. But as recent as on this rainy Monday, these truths are professed but have not yet fully lived out. On this rainy Monday, we Christians have talked many talks but obviously have walked very little, if any, of the walk.

That is why, the Baby Jesus was born unrecognized then and still unrecognized now. And that is why we are still waiting. That is why we are still longing. That is why we are still lighting the purple candles and praying for peace and pleading for the Emmanuel to come. Into our everyday. Into our every moment. Into the inner sanctum of our very heart. May this Advent lead us to not only seek but find the Baby Jesus. Truly, may this Advent be our last!
